How to play the music.

There are two ways I would suggest.

1. **MidiPlay.** This is my recommendation. This is a really first class program and it is free. To open it click [here](#). Accept the 'Open' option. The program will open and you will see the windows below. Questions? Click [here](#) to e-mail John.
2. **Windows Media Player.** If you double-click on the file name, it will open with your default media player. In most cases this will be Windows Media Player. If you have the latest edition, it is reasonably versatile. For full instructions on how to use the various functions, go to [here](#) and click on the Windows Media Player logo.

1. Click File>Open. Select ladyfair or bene .mid. You will find your voice listed in Track Names.

2. Double-click on the Voice name (not Play). I've selected Tenor. Your line will open in the correct stave. See 3 (Or select MIDI> fullscore, all tracks.)

3. Clicking Play opens the Control Panel right. The slider above Play changes the volume relative to other parts.

4. Usual play, stop, pause, rewind controls. You also change the relative tempo to slow down the difficult bits. Note the Bar No. for replay.
